
Lho Lungkar Gon in Kham, southern Tibet was founded in 1798 by Lho Drubchen Tingzing Sangpo (the 2nd Orgyen Nuden Dorjee), an embodiment of Tibet Great Yogi Milarepa and the Great Mahasiddha of India, Shri Singha.

### The Hagiography states:



The Lho Lungkar Gon Monastery derives its name from Yongzin Phuntsok Namgyal, a disciple of the first Lho Rinpoche Gyalwang Rinchen Phuntsok. He was born in Lhodrak in southern Tibet. The followers referred to him as "the lama from Lho", meaning from the south. Thereafter, his subsequent incarnations were known as Lhopas. The principle Lho Monastery later branched out into three sub-monasteries, i.e., Lho Miyel, Lho Palme, and Lho Lungkar Gon. Generally speaking, four major spiritual masters from Lho were Lama Lhochen, Lho Jedrung, Lho Chakme, and Lho Kunsang.

The 3rd H.E. Lho Ontul Rinpoche **Ontul Thrinley Rabgyal** was born in 1950. In 1957, His Eminence escaped to Nepal and wandered tirelessly in search of the Buddha Dharma. His Eminence received many oral teachings from various renown masters. His Eminence then set up the second Wogmin Thubten Shedrup Ling Monastery in the holy site of Rewalsar in 1971, where Guru Padmasambhava demonstrated his miraculous powers. The Monastery is now a center for many monks, nuns, followers, and lay devotees for learning, preserving and promoting of the Drikung Kagyu lineage of Tibetan Buddhism in India and aboard.





# The 3rd H.E. Lho Ontul Rinpoche and Lho Karma Ratna Rinpoche, his spiritual son:



The 3rd Lho Ontul Rinpoche, H.E. Ontul Thrinley Rabgyal was born in 1950 to a father named Namgyal Dorje and a mother Paltso.

When he was in mother's womb, his mother heard him shouted,
"I fell down from a cliff and landed in mother's womb. Mother don't worry,
Lama protects you."

His Eminence was the reincarnation of Drogben Kieuchung Lotsawa, who was one of the twenty five disciples of Guru Rinpoche.

His Eminence left Tibet in 1957 and studied the entire range of sutra and tantra texts from many renown masters, and became a learned master of high reputation.

Lho Karma Ratna Rinpoche Orgyen
Rangjung Drodul Dorje was born in 1980
as a spiritual heir to H.E. Lho Ontul
Rinpoche and recognized as the Quality
Emanation of the sixth Lho Drongdul
Rinpoche.

Lho Ratna Rinpoche is currently looking after the Monastery in Tsopema.



The 3rd H.E. Lho Ontul Rinpoche bought a piece of land in Rewalsar in 1971 and established the 2nd Wogmin Thupten Shedup Ling in Rewalsar, India, registered with number 5601/86 under the H.P. Cooperative Society Act XXI, 1860, as a non-profit and a charitable organization to preserve and promote Buddhist culture of non-violence and compassion through the teachings of the Drikung Kagyu lineage in the Himalayan regions. The Monastery is an important seat for the followers of Tibetan Buddhism. The Monastery has become a center for study, contemplation, and meditation on the Buddha Dharma, and thus for promoting global peace and the well-being of all sentient beings.

### Drikung Pe-Tsek Nang-Cho Lob-Ling (Drikung Lotus Mount Academy of Buddhist Studies)

The Drikung Lotus Mount Academy of Buddhist Studies, named by H.H. Drikung Chetsang Rinpoche, is a project initiated in 2012 by H.E. Lho Ontul Rinpoche and Ratna Rinpoche.

Its aim is to teach the monks the words of the Buddha, how to perform ritual practice in terms of Generation phase and Completion phase, how to play ritual instruments, along with the academic subject: Tibetan, English, Hindi, mathematics and computer use.

When the monks finished their eight years of training, they can either go onto Kagyu College or Sarnath for further studies, or to go on for retreat, or remain at the monastery to perform daily pujas and services.

As in every year, the school has been running smoothly without any problem despite the pandemic. All the monk students have managed to perform well in their examinations. The school have two semester examination in the year. The school has three main teachers who teach Buddhist philosophy, Tibetan and English Languages.

This year the school has 15 monk students from age 6 to 14 years old. Most of the students are from the remote







### The Library with Computer classes:

With the financial assistance from the Ministry of Culture, the Government of India, the Monastery successfully launched its school library and computer lab for the young monk students.

The area consists 7 desktop computers on the one side and a library on the other side. In the library, we have the entire Tibetan Buddhist Canon in Tibetan language, and an entire Prayer Texts of Drikung Kagyu in Tibetan from Jangchup Ling Monastery, Dehradun. We also have many Buddhist related books in English as well as a collection of the entire major subject volumes under C.B.S.E. board from LKG to 12th standard. We have also purchased other children's illustrated books in English, Tibetan and Hindi for the young novices.

With the help of our language teachers, the monk students are really taking advantages of this facility for their studies and the widening of the mind. We now provide two computer and library classes each week for all the monk students.



### **Education Fund:**

Currently, our monastery can barely provide a very nominal salary for the teachers and with this limited amount, we are finding it difficult to keep teachers with us for very long. We believe that if we could raise some fund for the teachers, then we might manage to attract and maintain good faculty members for the school, but due to these financial constraints and also lack of infrastructure, the school has remained informal till dated.

It is our genuine wish to make our school an affiliated institution either under the state or the central board examination of India in the near future. With this recognition, we are sure that both our teachers as well as monk students will make good use of the initiative, its scope and facilities in their respective fields of life.



### **Mandarava Holy Cave:**


Mandarava was a chief consort-disciple of Guru Padmasambhava who considered her to be a female guru-deity in Tantric Buddhism or Vajrayana.

According to a legend, Mandarava was born a princess in Zahor, near the city of Mandi in Himachal Pradesh, India. She renounced her royal birthright at an early age in order to practice the Dharma. Her devotion led her to bring at least 800 women, including her entire personal retinue, to the path of the Dharma, all before meeting her teacher, Padmasambhava. The place where she meditated is now a holy site to visit for the pilgrimage destination.



### **Protector Deity Achi Choekyi Drolma Temple:**

Achi Chökyi Drölma is the Dharma Protector of the Drikung Kagyu. Achi Chokyi Drolma is the grandmother of Jigten Sumgön, the founder of Drikung Kagyu. According to a prophecy in the Cakrasamvara Tantra, it is said, "The head of the Karma Dakinis will come to the area of Tidro cave in Drikung.



of Vajrayogini" The Temple consists of Dharma protectors such as Palden Lhamo, Gonpo Chakshe, Choekoung, and Achi Choekyi Drolma. It is often believed by the devotees that praying to Achi Choekyi Drolma will swiftly bring blessing and good fortune to all.

### **Khorkhang (Prayer Wheel Temple):**

The Monastery has three large prayer wheels containing many secret mantras in them.

According to the Tibetan Buddhist tradition based on the lineage texts regarding prayer wheels, spinning such wheels will have much the same meritorious effect as orally reciting the prayers.




### **Namkha Ling Retreat:**

It is a lovely place to do a long or short-term retreat. It has 13 cosy self-contained modern retreat houses have been constructed on the land in a beautiful setting. These provide the

perfect space in which to do retreat and practice. The retreat houses overlook the serene lotus lake and the scenery is breathtakingly beautiful. A small library is available for all retreatants and guests. Meals can be provided or self-cooking is possible so as to ensure that one can take full advantages of the precious time to do retreat. The Vegetarian Restaurant is close-by for delicious freshly prepared meals and a shop with necessities is on the premises. The café has a collection books raging from spirituality to travelogue and Wi-Fi Internet facilities are also available within the complex.







### **On the Oddiyana Retreat**

With a request from his foreign devotees, H.E. Lho Ontrul Rinpoche initiated the first ever Oddiyana retreat in Tsopema, India in 2003. The program was originally planned as ten long years of a guided training and meditation under H.E. Lho Ontrul Rinpoche's tutelage. Later, it was being held on alternative years.

In 2018, we hosted our 8th Oddiyana Retreat at the Monastery. It consisted in for a 7 long day retreat on the

Buddha Amitabha. Devotees and followers from India and aboard participated in the event. After the retreat, Rinpoche lead everyone for pilgrimage sites.



### A Recent Event Concerning Drikung Covid-19 Welfare Measures

Under the auspicious guidance of H.E. Lho Ontul Rinpoche and Ratna Rinpoche la, the Drikung Kagyu Monastery at Rewalsar has organized Covid-19 Welfare Measures in the aim of providing help to the vulnerable daily labourers from other states, poor local Indians and Tibetans living in and around Tsopema. With the generous help and contributions from many individuals and organizations, the Monastery successfully launched many social welfare activities as follows:



The Monastery successfully distributed more than 840 kg of packaged essential food items to 114 migrant labourers' families, 27 poor local Indian families, 26 needy Tibetan families, and 100 slum dwellers in Mandi during the nationwide lockdown in India.

The Monastery distributed medical supplies such as PPE kits, pulse oximeters, digital thermometers, examination gloves, N-95 masks, streamers, hand sanitizers, oxygen cylinder and nebulizer machines to the local Indian governmental departments, the local Tibetan clinic, the Tibetan Women's Association, the Bir Tibetan Society and the Soka school.



### The Extension of Monks' Residence:


The three story building will include rooms for the elder monks, classrooms, a recreational
